### E. THE GOSPEL STORY – I Corinthians 15: 3-4

### 1. *CHRIST'S LIFE* – Mt. 1-4, Mk. 1, Luke 1-4 & Jn. 1

a. Bethlehem: His birth

b. Jerusalem: His dedication – He was poor, cf. some of today's televangelists & preachers

c. Bethlehem: His visitors
d. Egypt: His protection
e. Nazareth: His home
f. Jerusalem@12: His wisdom

g. Perea at 30: His baptism – Why baptized? How He was identified as Messiah (Jn. 1:31-34) h. Wilderness: His temptation – The Word of God is our key to victory over sin – Mt. 4:1-10

i. Perea: His disciples

### 2. *CHRIST'S MINISTRY*:

a. Early GALILEAN ministry – John 2 Wedding at Cana (the 1st miracle)

#### b. Early JUDEAN ministry – John 2-4 cf. Mt. 3-4

- (1) Cleansing of the temple (Anger is not necessarily sin! Also, how can we ignore evil?) John 2
- (2) Discourse with Nicodemus John 3
- (3) Woman at the well-Samaria **Jn. 4** (*The Gospel is for everyone & there is no partiality with God!*)

At the time he was serving on the campus of Ohio State University as director of a collegiate ministry called the "Forever Generation," a Christian organization active then across America. Mike later became the pastor of Portersville Bible Church, Portersville, Pennsylvania. I also extracted much of the Acts material from a class syllabus by Dr. Stewart Custer, professor emeritus of Bible, Bob Jones University & pastor emeritus of Trinity Bible Church, Greer, SC. In addition, I've added much supplementary information over the years e.g. dates, names, events, applications, etc. The book "A Harmony of the Gospels" by Robert L. Thomas & Stanley Gundry proved invaluable in that regard.—Mike Edwards. - c. <u>Later GALILEAN ministry</u> Luke 4-9 cf. Mt. 5-18 & Mk. 1-6. Most of His ministry spent here)
- (1) Miracles Performed to authenticate & demonstrate who He was- e.g. Isa. 35:5-6; 61:1-2; etc.
- (2) Parables Matt. 13; etc., cf. Ps. 78:2
- d. Later *JUDEAN* ministry Luke 9-13; Jn. 7-10 cf. Mt. 12-17
- (1) 10 lepers cleansed (as He passes through Samaria)
- (2) Blind man healed
- (3) Sending out of "the 70"
- e. <u>Later *PEREAN* ministry</u> Luke 13-18 cf. Mt. 19-20; Mk. 10 & Jn. 11
- 3. <u>CHRIST'S DEATH</u> (The Final Week) Mt. 21-28; Mk. 11-16; Lk. 19-24 & John 11-21
- a. Triumphal entry
- b. Cleansing of the temple (cf. Ps. 69:9)
- c. Passover/Lord's Supper Christ is our redemption & delivers us, not from Egypt but from sin!
- d. Prayer in Gethsemane
- e. Betrayal (cf. Ps. 41:9)
- f. Arrest
- g. Trials
- h. Scourging (cf. Isa. 53)
- i. Crucifixion (cf. Ps. 22)
- j. Death
- k. Burial
- 1. Resurrection (This is the keystone of Christianity & what separates Christ from all others!)
- m. Ascension (Acts 1:9-11)
- II. <u>HISTORY</u> The "ACTS" of the risen Christ, through the Apostles, by the Holy Spirit!
- A. KEY VERSE: Acts 1:8
- B. KEY PERSONS: Peter (1-12) & Paul (13-28)
- C. GENERAL OUTLINE Acts 1:8
  - 1- Witnesses in Jerusalem Acts 1-7
  - 2- Witnesses in Judea and Samaria Acts 8-12

#### **D. DETAILED OUTLINE:**

#### The witness in *JERUSALEM* – 1-7

- 1- Commission & Ascension; Matthias chosen (*There are no apostles today or they'd be 2000 years old!*)
- 2- Pentecost; Peter's 1<sup>st</sup> sermon (*NT preaching was fearless, pointed, & held people responsible for their actions—consequently it wasn't always welcome or popular*)
- **3-** Lame man healed: Peter's 2<sup>nd</sup> sermon
- 4- Peter & John before the Sanhedrin
- 5- Ananias & Sapphira; the Apostles imprisoned ("We ought to obey God rather than men")
- **6-** The "Deacons" (*The main priorities in pastoral ministry are the Word, prayer, & shepherding.* Help your pastor by doing other tasks so that he can keep "first things first")
- 7- Stephen's sermon and martyrdom (Sometimes conviction leads not to conversion, but to anger & rebellion)

### The witness in JUDAEA & SAMARIA – 8-12

- 8- Philip, Simon the sorcerer, & the Ethiopian eunuch (*Baptism is by immersion*, & comes <u>after believing—so infant baptism is out!</u> Also, God cares about one as much as 100!)
- 9- Paul converted; Peter heals Aeneas & raises Dorcas
- **10-** Peter & Cornelius (*There is no partiality with God & God rewards earnest seekers*-cf. Jer. 29:13; Heb. 11:6; Matt. 7:7-8; etc.)
- 11- Peter defends Cornelius' conversion; the Church at Antioch
- 12- Arrest & deliverance of Peter; Death of Herod Agrippa I (We're responsible to do what we can ourselves, and we need to trust God for what we can't do! Also: James is killed & Peter delivered. Why? Answer: God's sovereign will. Don't ask God "Why?" [Dt. 29:29]. Instead ask Him "What?" e.g. "What are you trying to teach me? What am I supposed to learn & What am I supposed to manifest through this?")

## The witness unto THE UTTERMOST PART OF THE WORLD - 13-28

- 13- 1st Missionary Journey: Paul & Barnabas (all journeys begin at Antioch)
- a. Cyprus: Elymas the sorcerer; Paul takes over the leadership (*This is true discipleship!*)
- b. <u>Perga</u>: John Mark quits (*Failure is not final!* cf. II Tim. 4:11)
- c. Antioch of Pisidia: Paul's sermon; "Then we will go to the Gentiles"
- **14-** <u>Iconium</u>, <u>Lystra</u> (Paul stoned cf. II Cor. 12:1-10), <u>Derbe</u>, & return to <u>Antioch</u> via same route (<u>Galatians possibly written at this time</u>)
- 15- The Jerusalem Council; 2<sup>nd</sup> Missionary Journey begins Paul & Silas and Barnabas & Mark (*This council refutes the idea of Peter as the 1<sup>st</sup> pope & also that the Sabbath is for today*)
- 16- <u>Derbe, Lystra</u> (*Timothy-What we think are failures God may use to accomplish great things!*), <u>Iconium, Galatia; Troas</u>: Macedonian call-<u>Philippi</u> ("Need" does not necessarily constitute a "call!"-Ryrie, The Acts of the Apostles)
- 17- Thessalonica, Berea (Evaluate everything by the Word of God), Athens (Mars Hill) (app: In evangelism, try to find some common ground with unbelievers when you witness)
- 18-Corinth (*I & II Thessalonians* written); Ephesus (*Apollos*); 3<sup>rd</sup> Missionary Journey begins
- 19- <u>Derbe, Lystra, Iconium, Galatia, Ephesus</u> (burned the occult books), Diana of the Ephesians (The Gospel & Scripture trumps culture & tradition!)
  - (I & II Corinthians written at Ephesus)
- **20-** Philippi, Thessalonica, Berea, Corinth & back; Troas; address to the Ephesian elders (*Guard the sheep because wolves will come*)
  - (Romans written at Corinth)
  - Galatians written at Corinth, if not at end of the 1st journey
- 21- Trip to Jerusalem (Philip's house); Paul seized in the Temple
- **22-** Paul's defense to the Jewish multitude
- 23- Paul's defense to the Sanhedrin; The assassins; Caesarea
- **24-** Paul's defense to Felix
- 25- Paul's defense to Porcius Festus; the Appeal to Caesar (It's ok to use our rights as citizens to protect ourselves &/or further God's work!)
- **26-** Paul's hearing before Herod Agrippa II ("To be almost persuaded is to be almost saved, but to be almost saved is to be completely lost"-Brundage)
- **27-** Final Missionary Journey: The voyage to Rome: Sidon, Fair Havens-Crete, Melita (Malta)
- **28-** Events on Melita (*A believer is indestructible until his work on earth is done!*); Paul at Rome: (Prison epistles written: *Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians & Philemon*)

**Epilogue**: Paul was apparently released from prison then subsequently arrested again, probably during the reign of Nero, and beheaded—a "*privilege*" reserved only for Roman citizens. (*I & II Timothy & Titus* written, prior to his death).

- K. **II Timothy**: Apostasy in the end times
- L. **Titus**: *Pastoral instruction M.* **Philemon**: *Forgiveness*

## IV. GENERAL EPISTLES (theme/content)

- A. **Hebrews**: *The New Covenant* (64-68 A.D., author unknown)
- B. James: Practical Christian living (49 A.D., half-brother of Jesus. Perhaps the earliest NT book)
- C. **I Peter**: Suffering (63-64 A.D.) (**Faithful believers will suffer persecution!** cf. II Tim. 3:12)
- D. **II Peter**: *The Word of God inerrant & supreme & Apostasy in the end times* (66-67 A.D.)
- E. **I John**: *The marks of a true Christian; Love & truth* (88-90 A.D. from Ephesus?)
- F. II John: Apostasy in the end times (90 A.D.) (Ecclesiastical separation is biblical!)
- G. **III John**: *Christian hospitality* (90 A.D.)
- H. **Jude**: Apostasy in the end times (70-80 A.D. a half-brother of Jesus cf. Mt. 13:55; Mk. 6:3)

A. <u>Key Verse</u>: Rev. 1:19 ("write the things which you have seen (past), and the things which are (present) and the things which will take place after this" (future)
