#### TOWARD A THEOLOGY OF PERSECUTION<sup>1</sup>

<u>In the OT</u> we see a) some pleas for God to judge those who are doing the persecuting, b) sometimes an overlooking of persecution, c) using it to turn thoughts back to God & His Word & d) motivation to ask God for deliverance:

Jer. 15:15 – Take vengeance on my persecutors

Jer. 20:11 – My persecutors will stumble and not prevail

Jer. 17:18 – those who persecute me be put to shame

Psalm 31:15 – enemies and from those who persecute me

Ps. 119:84 – judgment on those who persecute me?

Ps. 119:86 –They have persecuted me with a lie

Ps. 129:1 & 2 – They have persecuted me from my youth up

Ps. 142:6 - Deliver me from my persecutors

## <u>In the NT</u>: Here we see a different type of response taught regarding those who persecute God's people:

- a) When you're persecuted "for Christ's sake" you are blest Mt. 5:11 insult you and persecute you
- b) We are to pray for our persecutors Mt. 5:44
- c) We are to *bless* our persecutors Rom. 12:14
- d) We are to move on when persecuted Mt. 10:23

### A fundamental axiom: Christians shouldn't be surprised by persecution since

a) The world has persecuted God's servants in both the OT & NT time period:

OT: Acts 7:52 – which of the prophets did your fathers not persecute?

NT: Acts 8:1; 11:19; 13:50 (various persecutions)

- b) **Christ promised it**: Mk. 10:30 children and farms, along with persecutions (!)
- c) Believers during the Tribulation will experience it:

Mt. 23:34 – and persecute from city to city

Lk. 21:12 – their hands on you and will persecute you

Lk. 11:49 – will kill and some they will persecute

- d) God's Word promises it: II Tim. 3:12 all that live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution
- e) It sometimes includes other negatives as well II Cor. 12:10 insults with distresses with persecutions

#### Righteous causes for persecution:

- a) The Word of God Mt. 13:21 & Mk. 4:17
- b) Preaching & standing up for Jesus Christ Jn. 15:20 If they persecuted me, they will persecute you

# All persecution against believers who do righteousness, is ultimately against our Lord Jesus:

Jn. 5:16 – for this reason were they persecuting Jesus (i.e. His claim of deity)

Acts 9:4 cf. 5 – Paul's testimony

Acts 22:7 cf. 8 - Paul's testimony

Acts 26:14 cf. 15 – Paul's testimony

#### What should be our response? We should persevere through persecution:

When persecuted we should endure – I Cor. 4:12

When persecuted we should remember that we are not forsaken – II Cor. 4:9

What does such righteous behavior often accomplish? It brings conviction to the enemies of Christ – Gal. 1:13

The ultimate and underlying source & author of persecution is Satan – Rev. 12:13
